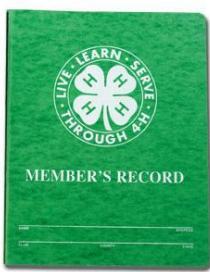
4-HOnline 2.0 Re-enrollment

4-HOnline has been upgraded and now has a new version called 2.0. Re-enrollment for 2021 will take place using the new system. Each year at the start of the enrollment cycle (calendar year), every 4-H member must re-enroll. This process is based on federal accounting policies. In mid-January you will receive specific information about re-enrollment timelines and instructions from Jordan. Be sure to complete this process, it is extremely important!
